

## Keep County Road 50 clear of Digital Electronic Media Pole signs!

A winery in our community has installed a Full Spectrum LED Digital Electronic Media Pole sign against our Town Bylaw. They have installed it without a permit. The sign is of great concern to residents for multiple reasons, including:

- safety of pedestrians and cyclists from distracted drivers,
- degradation of the historic character of CR50,
- introduction of light pollution and health hazards from LED lights,
- disruption to the quality of life of neighbours,
- reduces property values along CR50,
- zoned agricultural and residential, not commercial,
- proposed change in bylaw will allow all businesses on CR 50 to install Full Spectrum LED Digital Electronic media pole signs, and
- it is in direct conflict with our current sign bylaw that is less than 5 years old (max 2 metres high and no electronic signs allowed).

Very few jurisdictions in Canada permit use of digital media signs in such close proximity to residential areas.
