#### Crime:

- Reduce victimization from instances of sexual violence
- Address & prevent property crime
- Address & prevent illicit drug crime
- Support victims of domestic abuse
- Address the proliferation of illegal grow operations

#### Traffic:

- Year-round focus on causal factors of motor vehicle collisions with a focus on (Big 4) Aggressive Driving, Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving and Use of Seatbelts
- Marine enforcement and security on local waterways
- Streamline collision reporting


#### Other Policing Priorities:

- Identify co-response solutions for non-police-related demands for service




### Top Calls for Service <sup>1</sup>









# <u>Calls for Service<sup>3</sup></u>




- An 13.2% increase in Calls for Service February 2023 compared to February 2022




### Violent Crime<sup>4</sup>

## Property Crime<sup>5</sup>




- A 1.6% increase in Property Crime in February 2023 compared to February 2022. Clearance Rate = 16.2%

## Motor Vehicle Collisions<sup>6</sup>



- A 28.0% decrease in MVCs February 2023 compared to February 2022
- 50 collisions (27.0%) were diverted to the Collision Reporting Centre in February 2023
- Year-to-date a 9.7% decrease in MVCs in 2023 (408 collisions) compared to 2022 (452 collisions)







- A 100% increase in ADLS suspensions in February 2023 compared to February 2022


- A 9.1% decrease in Drug Offences in February 2023 compared to February 2022
- Year-to-date an 85.7% increase in Drug Offences in 2023 (26 incidents) compared to 2022 (14 incidents)
- A CSDA search warrant was executed on Garrison Avenue, Learnington residence in response to a cocaine trafficking investigation. A 55 yr. old male was charged with Trafficking. \$50,900 worth of cocaine was seized along with currency and evidence of drug trafficking.




# Provincial Offences 12

- Year-to-date, a 0.8% decrease in Provincial Offences in 2023 (1,002) compared to 2022 (1,010)






• An average of **24.6 recorded vehicle stops per day** (689 stops) in February 2023 compared to the 2022 average of 18.7 stops/day.

### **Notable Investigations**

Lakeshore	A resident of a north Woodslee neighbourhood contacted police to report a male chasing a vehicle before it crashed into a ditch. Officers flooded the area and located a Honda Civic with two occupants and stolen property in plain view. A search incident to arrest located a replica handgun in the vehicle and more stolen property including knapsacks, gift cards, ID, cheques and personal property. Two additional males were located nearby and arrested. In total, the four were charged with Possess Property Obtained by Crime, Possess Break-In Instruments, and Possess Weapon for a Dangerous Purpose. One male was additionally charged with Fail to Comply With Probation
Kingsville	Officers responded to a call in which the male caller said he broke into his own home and found his girlfriend and another female in the basement tied up, with rope around their necks. The male described the male as an acquaintance and former roommate. Investigation determined the male's erratic behariouv was drug-induced and had in fact started the previous day when he was kicked out of the home and stole a vehicle. With that car, the male drove to Lakeshore where he picked up his girlfriend and demanded she get into the vehicle. At some point that vehicle was crashed into a guardrail in Essex and the male then stole a pick-up truck. The man continued the rampage and crashed the truck in Kingsville not far from the caller's residence. Once inside he threated his girlfriend and the other female occupant, tied them up and barricaded the exits. As a result of these events, a 46 yr. old male was charged with Utter Threats x3, Assault x3, Forcible Confinement x2, Theft of Motor Vehicle x2 and Mischief. He remains in custody.
Lagrainatan	Officers responded to a rooming house after receiving information that a male was holding a gun to the head of another male. Officers located the suspect and a search incident to arrest resulted in the recovery of a replica Glock pistol, evidence of drug trafficking and \$4,500 worth of crystal meth and fentanyl. The 23 yr. old male was charged with Pointing a Firearm, Imitation Firearm while committing an offence and Possess for the Purpose of Trafficking (Schedule I) x3.
Leamington	A 23 yr. old male from Windsor used the Grandparent Scam to obtain \$10,000 from an elderly resident.  Male to be charged with Fraud Over and Personate Police. Warrant to be obtained.
	A member from the Child Sexual Exploitation Unit (CSEU) conducting a proactive Luring investigation discovered a 36 yr. old male communicating for a sexual purpose, a person he believed to be a 13 yr. old female. The male was arrested and charged with Luring x3 and his cellular phone seized as evidence.
Tecumseh	Officers responded to 21 calls for service in February at a local bar including a Bail Violation, and multiple Disturbances, Assaults, LLA violations (consuming alcohol in parked vehicles & public intoxication), traffic complaints and collisions which resulted in a 43 yr. old female charged with Impaired and Over 80, a 36yr. old male charged with Refuse Demand, another 36 yr. old male charged with Obstruct and Resist Arrest, a 22 yr. old male charged with Assault Peace Officer, Resist Arrest, Obstruct and a 31 yr. old male charged with Assault Peace Officer.
