RE: Water Supply By-Law and Water and Wastewater Billing and Collection Policy

Kate Giurissevich, Director, Corporate Services provided an update on the Water and Wastewater Billing and Collection Policy. Director Giurissevich outlined that bills will be issued by the Town of Essex once meter readings are completed and mailed out to residents by the second week of February for consumption from approximately December 6, 2023 to January 6, 2024 and that the due date for payments will be March 4, 2024. Director Giurissevich advised that there will be a penalty-free period on unpaid water and wastewater accounts between January 20, 2024 and March 30, 2024.

Councillor Verbeek briefly left the meeting at 6:09 PM during the update and returned at 6:10 PM.

12. County Council Update

Deputy Mayor Shepley provided Council with a summary of the December 20, 2023 County Council Meeting including that Essex Windsor Solid Waste Authority's 2024 Budget provides for an increase of 4.1% as well as an increase of \$1.00 per ton for the waste management fee for refuse delivered which works out to \$6.9M from the seven local municipalities and \$8M from the City of Windsor.

Deputy Mayor Shepley remarked that County Council received a report on preparing the failed Regional Waste Initiative showing the cost came in at around \$200,000.00 and that County Council approved its first Strategic Plan.

Deputy Mayor Shepley also advised that County Council received a report that provides details of the County's external financial commitments and updates on the County's Emergency Management Program were approved.

Deputy Mayor Shepley also mentioned that County Council directed Administration to hire a consultant to review Council remuneration and provide comparisons from other jurisdictions and that the 2024 County Budget is expected to be completed in the very near future.

Mayor Bondy mentioned that a report was recently sent to Town of Essex Council on community housing.
