Kevin Girard, Director, Infrastructure Services, explained that at the Regular Council Meeting of June 17, 2024, Council provided direction through a Notice of Motion requesting Administration to outline the feasibility of implementing a 2hour parking limit along King Street from Victoria Street to Walnut Street and Queen Street from King Street to Centre Street. He further notes that Council directed Administration to review the feasibility of implementing Community Safety Zones for St. Athony's Catholic School and Harrow Public School. He stated that Administration is recommending that Council direct Administration to implement the community safety zones in both areas.
