Community Update on COVID-19 Response

No new non-essential building permits, facility closure extended, committees go digital

In light of the rapidly evolving response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Town of Essex has taken additional measures to protect the community while maintaining essential services for residents.

- Council hosted their second online meeting on Monday, April 20. Video of the

 Council with essential business will also be conducted electronically. Citizens or
 stakeholders who wish to present as a delegation, or would like to watch committee

 Legislative Services (Clerks) Division at 519-776-7336 ext 1100 or 1101.
- The closure of all facilities and cancellation of programs has been extended until Sunday, May 31.
- The Town continues to conduct inspections for buildings with permits received prior to April 4. Inspections and permits will continue to be provided for all new buildings deemed essential by Provincial Order. Following the guidance of local and provincial health authorities, the Town is asking residents to limit all non-essential trips and travel, avoid gatherings of five or more, and maintain thorough environmental and personal cleaning practices.
