# Recommendation(s)

**That** Parks and Facilities-2022-01 entitled "Ice Rental/Floor Rate Increase Starting 2022-2023 Season" prepared by Jake Morassut, Manager, Parks and Facilities dated February 7, 2022 be received, and

That Council approve a 1.5% rate increase for all ice rentals beginning August 1st, 2022.

## **Purpose**

To seek Council's approval for a rate increase at both ice facilities beginning in 2022/2023.

## **Background and Discussion**

The Town of Essex has been operating both the Essex Centre Sports Complex and the Harrow and Colchester South Community Centre with no change to the user fees since 2012. Since that time frame, according to Statistics Canada Report from 2012-2021, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased by 14.53% and while the Town of Essex has made these annual

inflationary adjustments to the yearly operating expense budget, the revenues have remained unadjusted.

This increase is important to ensure a high level of service can continue to be provided to the user groups while maintaining fiscal responsibility to the tax base as the cost to maintain these facilities is increasing each year.

With an increase in user fees of 1.5%, the Town of Essex will continue to maintain the same rental rate structure, which includes weekday daytime rates, as well as the preferred rate for youth organizations. The 1.5% increase will apply to the base fee only and does not include the "Capital Surcharge" which is applied to each rental in the Essex Centre Sports Complex.

Minor sport organizations will be conducting registration in the coming months; for this reason, administration is looking to receive Council's approval early in the year to ensure the organizations have time to prepare their budgets for the next ice rental/floor rental season.

A survey of local municipality ice rates was completed and is indicated in the below chart with the current and proposed fees for the Town of Essex (prices inclusive of HST):

## **Financial Impact**

The Town of Essex will expect to see an increase in ice rental revenues in 2022 at the Essex Centre Sports Complex of approximately \$3,944.46 (including the non-refundable tax) and \$8,451.00 each year thereafter. The Town of Essex will also see an increase in ice rental revenues in 2022 at the Harrow and Colchester South Community Centre of \$2,415.50 (including the non-refundable tax) and \$4,831.00 each year thereafter. These additional revenues will be used to offset the increased costs of staffing, equipment, utilities, and contractors for the facilities.
